RESIDENTIAL HOUSES.

All houses have a common room with chairs, carpets, and satellite TV. Some have board games, darts, table tennis, magazines and a small house library. TV is allowed at set times during the week and at weekends but ALL videos must be vetted by the Houseparent.

We aim to teach children good study habits and how to keep themselves, their clothes, and their cubicles clean. Pupils learn respect for senior pupils but fagging and initiation of Form 1 pupils are NOT allowed. We try to teach seniors to lead by example, rather than controlling by fear.

We integrate pupils of all ages into a house, which will normally be their home for the rest of their time at Watershed. Houses are divided into Junior and Senior wings. Seniors are expected to exert authority without resorting to excessive punishment. Corporal punishment may only be administered by Houseparent's in charge of boys' Houses.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I GET SICK?

The college has a sanatorium, staffed by two trained nurses. There are daily consultation times and the school doctor



visits the school once a week. In case of an emergency, pupils are taken through to Borradaile hospital in Marondera. A Physiotherapist also visits the school once a week.

WHAT DO I WEAR AND WHEN?

Weekdays:

No 2 uniform until after lunch.

Sports uniform or No 2 until 5.15pm.

Civvies may only be worn within the hostel, or on organised civvies days.

Weekends: No's 2 uniform or sports clothes until signing out.

Exeats: Pupils must wear No's 1 uniform whether they travel by bus or with their parents.

No's 1 Uniform:

To be worn: (i) When travelling.

(ii) All boarders wear No's 1 uniform for chapel on Sundays.

(iii) Boarders must sign out and return wearing No's 1 uniform.

(iv) At other formal school occasions.

Boys: Long beige trousers, beige socks, dark brown lace-up shoes, blue shirt, school tie, turquoise V-neck jersey, and a navy blue blazer.

Leaders wear a white shirt.

College Leaders:

Long navy blue trousers, black socks, black lace-up shoes, white shirt, school tie, white V-neck jersey and a cream blazer.

The anorack may NOT be worn with No. 1 uniform.

Girls: Beige skirt, blue shirt, school tie, turquoise V-neck jersey, navy blue blazer, beige slacks and scarf in winter only.

beige socks and dark brown lace-up shoes.

L6 and LAG may wear dark brown court shoes.

Leaders wear a white shirt.

College Leaders:

Navy blue skirt, white shirt, school tie, black court shoes, cream blazer, white V-neck jersey.

The anorack may NOT be worn with No. 1 uniform.

No's 2 Uniform

Boys: Khaki shorts, khaki shirt, turquoise V-neck jersey, long grey socks and veldskoens.

Complete tracksuit, scarf may be worn in winter only.

Anorack – not to replace a tracksuit top.

U6 and UAG may wear dark brown lace-up shoes, blue shirt.

Leaders may wear a white shirt.

College Leaders may wear a navy blue V-neck jersey.

Floppy white hat or white cap must be worn outside in the afternoon.

Girls: Beige skirt, floral/light blue blouse, short beige socks, dark brown leather lace-up shoes, turquoise V-neck jersey.

Scarf may be worn in winter only.

Anorack – not to replace a tracksuit top

L6 and LAG may wear a blue shirt.

Leaders may wear a white shirt.

College Leaders may wear a navy blue V-neck jersey,
Floppy white hat or white cap must be worn outside in the afternoon.

SPORTS CLOTHES

Boys:

Navy blue or white boxer shorts, white sports golf shirt, white takkies, white socks, hockey socks, rugby socks, track suit, blue peak hat (tennis only), white floppy cricket hat, rugby jersey, rugby boots, hockey boots, school swimming trunk.

Girls:

Turquoise gym skirt, navy blue or white boxer shorts, white sports golf shirt, white socks, hockey socks, white takkies, or trainers, tracksuit.

School swimming costume (navy blue & turquoise), navy swimming cap.

(Swimming team - turquoise towel), blue peak hat (tennis only), white floppy cricket hat.

- *TEAM players may be offered team T-shirts, Sweat shirts, towels etc. Purchase of these extras is OPTIONAL.*
- *Students must wear the appropriate clothes for each sporting discipline.*
- *House T-shirts will be worn for house matches only.*
- *Travelling sports teams should be in sports kit and blazer or sports kit and full tracksuit.*
- *Tour Kit – only for touring teams.*

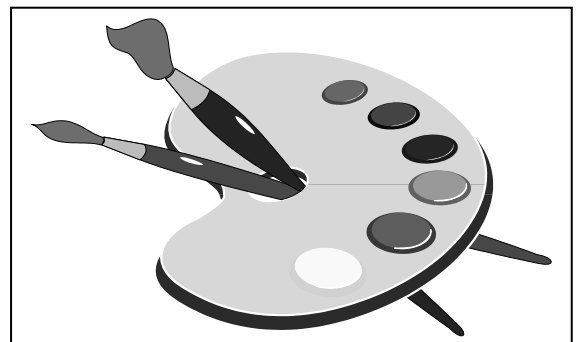
WHAT DO I DO ABOUT MY LAUNDRY?

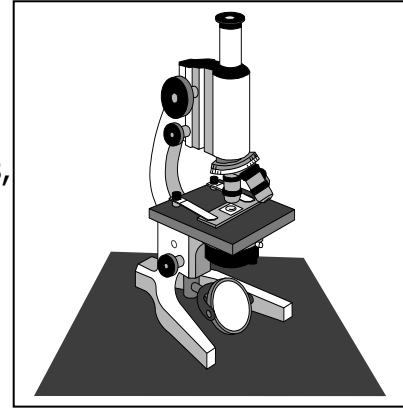
Sixth Form:

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY IN THE SCHOOL

In July 1996, our purpose - built computer lab was fitted out with 20 Pentiums, all with CD ROMs. At the start of 2003, we purchased a further 20 computers and opened a second lab, which not only greatly increased the number of computers available to students, but aided us tremendously in teaching the International Computers Drivers Licence course to our Sixth Formers. Now we have both labs fitted with state-of-the-art computers, all connected to the internet.



Forms 1 and 2 have normal computer lessons built into their time-table, and all forms have supervised access in the afternoons for project and individual study. Our aim is that all students will be computer literate by the end of their second year.

Every student in the college has an e-mail address.

SPORTS AVAILABLE

Girls' priority sports are swimming, tennis and volleyball (terms 1 and 3) and hockey and basketball (term 2).

Other sports include: softball and squash.

Boys' priority sports are cricket, tennis and basketball (terms 1 and 3), hockey and rugby (term 2). Other sports include squash, swimming and soccer.

Athletics is a priority sport for both girls and boys in the latter part of the first term.





There are also interhouse competitions in all sports during the year. We have regular fixtures against other schools. We host teams and travel throughout Zimbabwe for rugby, hockey, cricket, tennis, swimming, basketball, volleyball and squash.

Students bring their own hockey sticks, tennis and squash rackets.

We have had visiting teams from South Africa, the U.K. and Malaysia to play hockey, cricket, rugby and basketball. Our students regularly tour South Africa and Namibia to play, hockey, rugby and cricket.

WHEN CAN I GO HOME AND WHO CAN SIGN ME OUT?

Only adults on the signing out list can sign a pupil out. Signing out times are on Saturday (other than fixture free weekends) and the time depends on sports fixtures (time is specified in the term diary). Signing out at weekends before the prescribed time is done only after a written request has been made to the Headmaster by your parent or guardian at least a week in advance. Such requests must be followed up by a telephone call for confirmation. To add a name to the signing out list, parents or guardians must send a letter to the Houseparent in good time for the weekend.

WHEN DO I HAVE TO RETURN TO SCHOOL AFTER A WEEKEND?

By 7:15 am on Monday OR by 5:30 pm on Sunday. The FIRST weekend of the year is closed for FORM 1 pupils only. The LAST weekend of every term is CLOSED for all pupils and only under very exceptional circumstances are pupils allowed to go early at the end of term. Any such requests should be made in writing to the Headmaster at least a fortnight before the date.

WHAT HAPPENS AT AWAY FIXTURES?

On Saturdays only, pupils can be signed out wearing sports clothes if they have been playing sport but they must return to school wearing No 1 uniform.

TEAM LISTS

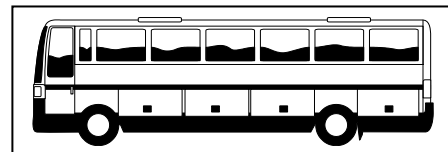
The School Secretary has team lists for all fixtures and can advise on expected finishing times or return to the College. Queries should be made during normal working hours.

The local Independent schools share transport to and from Mutare. Names are given to the Administration Officer each fixture-free weekend.

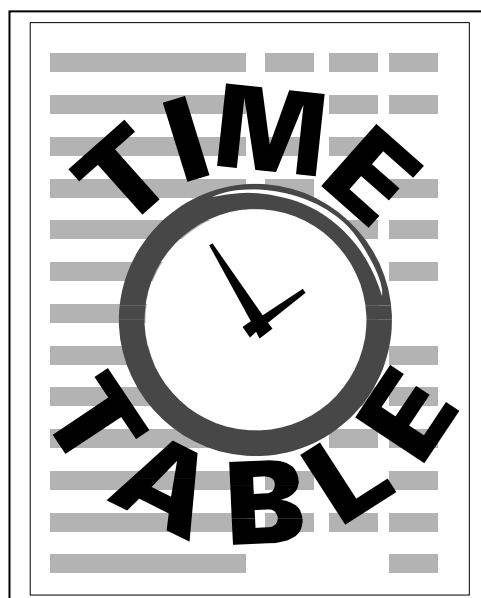

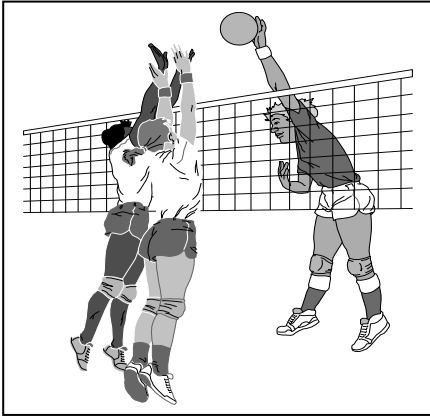
WHEN DO I COME BACK FROM A FIXTURE-FREE WEEKEND?

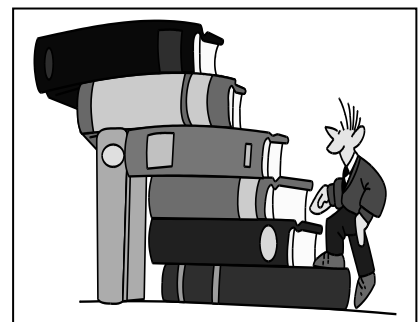
HOW DOES THE PHONE SYSTEM WORK?

The offices and houses are linked by phone from the main switchboard. All pupils' phone calls must go via House parents. There are set times for pupils receiving incoming calls in their house common rooms. Students may have cell phones but have to follow the rules with regard to these.

WHEN CAN I USE THE LIBRARY?

The library is very well stocked with reference and general works as well as magazines for project work. Forms 1 - 4 have regular library classes each week and pupils are encouraged to use the library in the afternoons. There are computers connected to the internet, for research purposes.



THE CHAPEL

We have a magnificent Inter-denominational chapel where the weekly Sunday chapel services are conducted. In addition, a weekly service is held, where guest speakers or the ministers fraternal address the school. The chapel is also available for quiet devotional purposes.



WHAT EXTRA - CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES ARE THERE AT WATERSHED?

Clubs

There are about 35 to choose from. Some examples are: Educational Games, Table Tennis and Darts, Magazine, Art, Scripture Union, Squash, Aerobics, Chess, Debating, First Aid, Girls' Craft, Interact, Quiz and Music.

Sport Tours:

These are organized each year as the opportunity arises. Teams from outside the country visit Watershed frequently.

Camps:

Outward Bound and Ecology and Science camps are organised on a regular basis and children are encouraged to participate regardless of their ability or experience.

Field Trips

Academic subjects field trips are part of the curriculum and students are expected to participate.

Professional Tennis Coaching

Coaches take pupils individually and in groups. The cost varies depending on the number of pupils in the group and the number of sessions per week.
